#### **BOLIVIA AND PARAGUAY 2018**

End of June to end of July

During Summer 2018 I did a trip in Bolivia and Paraguay with Mayte Samblas and Natalia Rodrigues. I won't explain all the problems we had during this trip and will mention only the species I saw.

We arrived in Santa Cruz de la Sierra in Bolivia. After getting a Toyota Hilux and the permit to visit KAA IJAA National Park in Bolivia we drove to this park where we stayed 7 nights sleeping at 2 different places Tucavaca and Isoso. Even it was free we had always a ranger during our driving. After that we returned to Santa Cruz, then drove on the way to Paraguay. In Paraguay we went to Defensores del Chaco where we stayed 6 nights(I at Cerro Leon and the rest at Madrejon). Then we went to Bahia Negra and Fuente Olimpo for 8 nights loosing a lot of time for the logistic.

After that we returned for 2 nights in Defensores del Chaco spending 1 night at Madrejon and 1 night at Agua Dulces. Then we left and split near the border of Paraguay. I returned to Santa Cruz by bus.

### **Drive to Kaa Ijaa**

We saw many dead animals stopping only to identify Capybaras and 2 Tamanduas.

## Kaa Ijaa National Park

We drove sometimes by day light, mainly in the morning and late afternoon. Each night we drove and spotlighted. Here are the species we saw:

Jaguarundi: 1 laying on the road during the morning.

Jaguar: 1 early morning close to Isoso

Ocelot: 1 seen twice chasing 2 Crab Eating Fox close to Tucavaca

Crab Eating Fox: many

Tayra: 1 outside of the park. 2 black animals seen from far in the park were either Tayra or Jaguarondis.

Azara's Agouti: 2

Gray Brocket Deer (Common Brown Brocket Deer)s: 10+ mainly outside of the park

Giant Anteater: 1 by night close to Isoso.

Three Banded Armadillos: at least 10

Pale Titi Monkey: only 1 group very shy (only 1 was seen)

Tapiti: several

Lowland Tapir: 2 by night (1 ran in front of the car; when we stopped it finally came back close to the car and finally rushed in the forest).

Puma and Giant Armadillo had also been camera trapped near Isoso

#### **Defensores del Chaco National Park**

Jaguarundi: 1 crossed the road at 4pm

Jaguar: 2 sightings between Madrejon and Cerro Leon (1 was on a side road). Both time by night and seen very close to the car

Puma: 1 by night etween Madrejon and Cerro Leon

Ocelot: at least 8 sightings

Unidentified cat: maybe an immature Ocelot, but the tail was relatively long

Crab Eating Fox: a few (less common than in Kaa Ijaa

Pampas Fox: only 3

Tayra: 1 south Cruce de Mayo on the way to Defensores

Chacoan Mara: no more than 5 (mainly outside the park)

Gray Brocket Deer (Common Brown Brocket Deer): very few

Lowland Tapir: 1 seen twice

Three Banded Armadillos: 3

Giant Armadillo: old den unoccupied

Pale Titi Monkey: 6 groups like frozen after a cold night (first time we saw them easily) at

Agua Dulces

Azara's Night Monkey: 3 at Agua Dulces one morning after a cold night

Black Tailed Marmoset: at least 6 at Agua Dulces Station

Common Vampire: 2 discovered by Mayte in a house at Agua Dulces

Greater Hairy Armadillo: 1 east La Patria outside of the park and a dead one west Villazon in

Bolivia

# **Bahia Negra-Fuente Olimpo**

Three Banded Armadillos: 2

Common Red Brocket Deer: 3

Collared Peccary: 1 Bahia Negra, at least 6 between Bahia Negra and Agua Dulces (identification I confirmed with the photos provided me; at least 4 were seen west of Villazon (Bolivia) not far from the border with Paraguay on our uncessfull attempt to cross the border at this place.

Three Banded Armadillo: at least 2

Giant Anteater: 1 dead

Tapiti: at least 2

Lowland Tapir: 2

Pale Titi Monkeys: 2 groups only heard (this species is very shy, early morning after a cold night is the best way to see them)

I hope this short trip report will be usefull to other mammalwatchers.

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
