With at least at least 123 species of birds registered in the property (data provided by https://ebird.org/hotspot/L17103197), in addition to other species of fauna, they protect **the Magdalena marimonda or Choibo, and blue-billed curassow,** species critically endangered by habitat loss (according to IUCN). You could find there the white-faced monkey, Colombian red howler, red squirrel, morrocoy turtles, babilla and common toad. Unfortunately I did not see but they have capture in the tramp cameras, jaguars, puma concolor, armadillos and many more species. In terms of flora, there are records of at least 117 species distributed in 56 families (Wildlife Conservation Society, 2017). The conservation area consists of existing forests on the property and the protective forest strips of streams and creeks. This zone covers a total of 300 Hectares.

The reserve boasts an impressive variety of ecosystems, including natural forests, secondary vegetation, and pastures of the Magdalena and Caribbean humid tropical zone. There are also plenty of bodies of water, such as the stunning La Dorada Creek, which support a rich diversity of aquatic life.

With over 300 hectares of land protected the RNSC, El Porvenir Natural Reserve is a truly special destination that offers visitors a chance to connect with nature and make a real difference in the world. So why wait? Go and experience the wonder of this ecological paradise for yourself and discover the true meaning of sustainable tourism.

From the moment I arrived, I was struck by the warm welcome I received from the locals. The staff at the retreat went above and beyond to make me feel at home, sharing stories about their way of life and offering invaluable tips on how to fully experience the natural wonders that surrounded me.
