No	Common name	Scientific name	Year seen	Countries seen in	Additional info
1	Iberian Lynx	Lynx pardinus	2018	Spain	Seen twice from a hide in Sierra de Andujar in 3 days. The second observation was great with nice pictures.
2	Lion	Panthera leo	2018	Namibia, South-Africa	A female with a kill in Etosha National Park and two males in Pilanesberg.
3	Cheetah	Acinonyx jubatus	2018	Namibia	Quite a far observation of one resting under a tree in Etosha.
4	Leopard	Panthera pardus	2018, 2023	Namibia and India	Close observation of one resting in a tree in Etosha, many good observations in Pench with Leopards walking past the car and resting in trees and on rocks.
5	African Wildcat	Felis Lybica	2019	Morocco	A close observation of one in the Western Sahara
6	Sand Cat	Felis margarita	2019	Morocco	A brilliant observation of one at close range during the day resting in an old ravens nest. Also some observations at night while spotlighting
7	Puma	Puma concolor	2019	Chile	Several very close observations in Torres del Paine with the highlight watching 3 pretty much full-grown cubs together
8	Guiña	Leopardus guigna	2019	Chile	One leaping across the path during the day in Tepehueico on the island Chiloé.
9	Sunda Leopard Cat	Prionailurus javanensis	2019	Malaysia	Seen several on Malaysian Borneo with the first one at Danum Valley and many at Deramakot.
10	Marbled Cat	Pardofelis marmorata	2019, 2023	Malaysia, India	One brilliant observation of one resting on a tree branch at Danum Valley in Malaysian Borneo. The other one a very short observation at close distance in Eaglenest Wildlife Sanctuary in India.

<b>11</b>	Sunda Clouded Leopard	<i>Neofelis diardi</i>	2019	Malaysia	One brilliant observation in Malaysian Borneo at Deramakot.
<b>12</b>	Flat-headed Cat	<i>Prionailurus planiceps</i>	2019	Malaysia	A quick observation of one standing up and walking away on the bank of the Kinabatangan River in Malaysian Borneo
<b>13</b>	Jaguarundi	<i>Herpailurus yagouaroundi</i>	2021	Bolivia	Two observations in Jaguarland / La Moneda in Bolivia. One walking towards the car and the other one peaking out of the grass at close distance, but seen through the car windshield.
<b>14</b>	Ocelot	<i>Leopardus pardalis</i>	2021	Bolivia	Seen several in Jaguarland / La Moneda in Bolivia, the first one leaping on the path at night catching a rat.
<b>15</b>	Jaguar	<i>Panthera onca</i>	2021	Bolivia	One walking on a soy field at 200m distance at dusk in Jaguarland / La Moneda in Bolivia
<b>16</b>	European Wild Cat	<i>Felis silvestris</i>	2021	Netherlands	Several unidentified cat specs, two seen well enough to count. Both cats running or sneaking away. Seen at Vaals in the Netherlands
<b>17</b>	Jungle Cat	<i>Felis chaus</i>	2022	Azerbaijan	Seen one at night sitting for 5 minutes in the reed at Shirvan Park in Azerbaijan.
<b>18</b>	Snow Leopard	<i>Panthera uncia</i>	2023	India	Several observations in Hemis National Park. First one seen high up resting on a rock. The other ones seen in Rumbak Valley with one fantastic observation at relatively close range and a whole day watching Snow Leopards mating (15 times!)
<b>19</b>	Pallas' Cat	<i>Otocolobus manual</i>	2023	India	Two sightings around the village Hanle. One at very close distance which we could sneak up on because it was focused on catching a vole.
<b>20</b>	Mainland Leopard Cat	<i>Prionailurus bengalensis</i>	2023	India	Seen at Eaglenest Wildlife Sanctuary. One I hesitate to count because I saw only its hind legs and tail. Could not be any other cat, but that's pretty much it...

<b>21</b>	Tiger	<i>Panthera tigris</i>	2023	India	Two observations at Pench. First one walking very close past the jeep.
<b>22</b>	Rusty-spotted Cat	<i>Prionailurus rubiginosus</i>	2023	India	One very unexpected great observation in the bufferzone of Pench. Sitting in the grass at first at 15m and then walking away and sitting on a rock. Watched it for about 10 minutes.
