

Kenya Mammal & Bird Tour, August 2023

Late last year, Tyler Santiago-Gamble got in touch with me to start discussing the possibility of doing a mammal and birding trip across Kenya in mid 2023. After looking at his target species, we formulated a rough itinerary and started putting the trip together. Tyler decided to advertise the trip on a number of online forums to see if anyone else wanted to join. Ben Allen, a gentleman from Nairobi, agreed to join for most of it, but wouldn't be able to join us for the last few stops.

Before Tyler was going to join me, he had signed up for a Conservation and Ecology short course through [Edu-Africa](#), which allowed him to spend a couple of weeks in the Mara ecosystem. They were based in Pardamat Conservation Area, but had a chance to visit Naboisho Conservancy and the main Maasai Mara National Reserve. He had also spent several days at Brackenhurst in Limuru, where a very successful Botanical Garden and forest restoration programme has brought back loads of biodiversity. So before I had even met Tyler, he'd already seen a high number of both mammal and bird species, along with a few herps.

So on 29th of July, 2023, I met Tyler and Ben at Malindi airport along Kenya's north coast, and we made a bee-line due north to Ishaqbini Hirola Community Conservancy, on the eastern bank of the Tana River. We were here primarily for **Hirola**, which we caught several glimpses of, but also had some good sightings of **Tana River Red Colobus** and **Small-eared Galago** around our campsite. Additional highlights for this area were **Coastal Topi**, **Somali Lesser Galago**, **Somali Dwarf Mongoose**, and a very clear, long sighting of an **African Civet**. A few of the larger mammals here were not new for Tyler, as he'd seen them in the Mara, but we marked them down as new for our trip together: **Northern Yellow Baboon**, **Eastern Vervet Monkey**, **Pousargue's Monkey**, **Unstriped Ground Squirrel**, **Black-tailed Gerbil**, **Cape Hare**, **Black-backed Jackal**, **Common Genet**, **Plains Zebra**, **Desert Warthog**, **Reticulated Giraffe**, **Southern Lesser Kudu**, **Hinde's Dik-dik**, **Southern Gerenuk**, and **Common Waterbuck**.

The following day, we moved on to the Tana River Primate National Reserve, directly opposite Ishaqbini, on the western bank of the Tana. Here we had Tana River Red Colobus around us all the time, but also had good views of **Tana River Mangabey**. We managed to pick up a few other new species, including **Kenya Coast Dwarf Galago**, **Senegal Lesser Galago**, **Red-bellied Bush Squirrel**, **Large-spotted Genet**, **White-tailed Mongoose**, **Common Hippopotamus**, **Bushbuck**, and **Harvey's Duiker**.

From TRPNR, we moved down to Watamu, to spend time in Arabuko Sokoke Forest and the limestone caves around Jimba. I won't list all the species here, but you can see the full list at the bottom of the document. Highlights were **Golden-rumped Giant Sengi**, **Four-toed Sengi**, and **African Trident Bat**. Unfortunately, as there's been both Lion and Leopard caught on camera traps in Arabuko Sokoke, the forestry warden has prohibited night activities for visitors, so we were not able to do a night drive to look for the Sokoke Dog Mongoose, or the myriad other nocturnal species in the forest. We did pick up plenty of good birds in the forest, the best of which was probably the **Sokoke Scops Owl**. While at the caves, we were lucky to meet Dr. Paul Webala, the eminent expert on bats in Africa, along with a team from Bat Conservation International, and some photographers. They were there to document the bats in the caves we were visiting and to make emergency plans to protect the land immediately surrounding the caves, much of which is suddenly under threat from development. Right outside the entrance of one of the most important caves, there's a brand new, large construction project that was cause for great concern. Large projects like this often come with noise, dust, and light pollution, all of which can be very disorienting for bats as they leave the cave in the evening. We also spent an afternoon at Mida Creek, where we very quickly racked up a long list of new bird species! This was a great afternoon and would have been considerably less productive if it wasn't for the expertise of the local guide I often work with. I strongly believe that working with local guides is a contribution towards the conservation of the resources we're traveling to enjoy. Local guides everywhere I go spend their free time and sometimes personal savings to protect the habitats that house some of Kenya's rarest species. They travel around the local communities educating them about sustainable resource management and working to reduce poaching and human-wildlife conflict. They train the next generation of youngsters to form an appreciation for nature and take ownership of local natural resources. So if you're visiting an area with local guides, PLEASE do use them, even if you think you have a reasonable chance of finding some of your targets on your own. Their daily rates are often very reasonable, and you're making a contribution towards a long-term investment for conservation.

After 3 nights in Watamu, we spent most of the following day driving through Tsavo East National Park on our way to Rukinga Ranch. One of the best highlights of the day was another *Hirola* that happened to cross our path as we were trundling along through an otherwise very quiet area. This was also where we saw our first **Lion, Maasai Giraffe, Impala, Coke's Hartebeest, and Eastern (common) Warthog** of the trip, though of course Tyler had seen plenty of them in the Mara. **Peter's Gazelle** and **Fringe-eared Oryx** were completely new species for Tyler.

We spent the night in Rukinga Conservancy, and went out for a night drive after dinner, where we found **Bat-eared Foxes** very quickly, along with some Gerbils, and a somewhat unsatisfying, fleeting glimpse of a **Rufous Sengi**. Our night drive ended with an excellent view of a **Spotted Eagle-Owl**. The following morning we went out looking for better views of the Sengi, but didn't get lucky. We did manage to find plenty of great birds, including **Tsavo Sunbird**, as well as **Bush Hyrax, Ochre Bush Squirrel, and Banded Mongoose**. Despite spending plenty of precious time looking, we did not find Klipspringer on the rocks where I have found them in the past. Eventually we had to move on.

From Rukinga, we drove up into the Taita Hills. Here we had a few target birds, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians. We'd allocated 2 days, and we'd spend as much time in the field as necessary. With the help of two separate local guides (one for birds during the day, and one for mammals at night), we were able to tick off most of our targets, including the 3 endemic birds, the **Taita White-Eye, Taita Thrush, and Taita Apalis**. We also had difficult, but good night-time views of **Eastern Tree Hyrax**, and a quick, but very satisfying view of **Ansorge's Pouched Rat**. With the help of the groundskeeper at our hotel, we found a single **Wahlberg's Epauletted Fruit Bat**, an endemic **Taita Blade-horned Chameleon**, and up in the forest were able to find another endemic, the **Taita Hills Caecilian**, a strange, worm-like amphibian that lives in wet leaf litter. Try as we might, we were not able to find the other endemic amphibian, the Taita Hills Warty Frog.

Having missed Klipspringer in Rukinga, we decided to drive through Tsavo West on our way to Amboseli. Along with several species we'd already seen, we had great views of **Klipspringer**, and a decent view of a female **Chanler's Mountain Reedbuck**. From here we got to Amboseli, and spent the afternoon in the park until we had to leave at 6pm. Being the middle of peak tourist season, it had been a nightmare trying to find accommodation inside the park, or even in one of the excellent conservancies outside. We made the most of where we were and did some night walks around the grounds of our lodge to find **Grey-bellied Pygmy Mouse**, and **Woodland Thicket Rat**.

The following day, we spent the whole day with one primary goal – African Golden Wolf. The marshes in the centre of the park provided some excellent birding, and our bird list shot up considerably. We also had good views of an unknown species of **Slit-faced Bat** in a weird corridor in the back of the little building at the main airstrip. Just before we stopped for a lunch break, we managed to find an **Egyptian Mongoose**, which is never an easy species to find, and can never be guaranteed. We spent much of the afternoon in an area where we knew the Wolves seem to spend most of their time. We knew we had to be out of the park by 6 (officially). While sitting and scanning the plains, at the 11th hour at 5:30pm, Tyler excitedly pointed to some canids running in the distance behind us. We swung the vehicle around just in time to watch an **African Golden Wolf** catch a Cape Hare and run across the road to get away from a mobbing Thomson's Gazelle and a couple of crafty Tawny Eagles. A second wolf then appeared and we had a wonderful sighting with them in the golden evening sun for as long as we could before having to rush off to get out of the park on time.

We left Amboseli early the following morning for Nairobi, where we'd drop Ben back at his home before continuing on to the Aberdares. Although we were focused mainly on Birds and Mammals, a few of Tyler's target species were reptiles, so Ben kindly took us around his garden to find several **Kikuyu Three-horned Chameleons**. We tried for Brown House Snake, which is common there, but didn't get lucky. By the time we got to the Aberdares, it was only 3pm, so we decided to go in and spend the afternoon in the park before heading to our accommodation for the night. The highlight this afternoon was a good number of **Giant Forest Hogs**. That evening, we headed to Sandai Farm for the night. After a hearty dinner, we went out around the 100 acre property, where we had our first views of **Southern Tree Hyrax**, and a fleeting glimpse of a pair of **Crested Porcupines**. The owner, Petra, sometimes sees Maned Rat around, but we didn't get lucky. She also mentioned that she'd recently been visited regularly by a curious Striped Hyena around sunset most days. Unfortunately, we'd been inside the park at that time, and had missed the opportunity.

The following day, we spent the whole day in Aberdare National Park, first down in the forested 'Salient', and then up in the moorlands. Highlights of the day included **Kikuyu Guereza Colobus**, **Black-fronted Duiker**, **Common Duiker**, **Kolb's Monkey**, **African Root-Rat**, and **Typical Striped Grass-Mouse**. It was a good thing we'd gone in the previous afternoon, as this entire day we didn't see a single Giant Forest Hog. Strangely, we also did not see any Serval Cat, which are often common throughout the park. Two of Tyler's target species for the Aberdares were reptiles: Montane Viper (*Montatheris hindii*) and Aberdare Mountains Dwarf Chameleon (*Trioceros kinangopensis*). The viper tends to come out most on warm sunny days, sitting between or on the large grass tussocks of the moorland. Sadly, most of the time we were up there, it was misty, wet, and overcast, and we were unable to find the Viper. The chameleon was always going to be difficult, and we had to settle for a **Helmeted Chameleon** instead.

After a second night at Sandai, we spent the following morning looking for Nairobi Grass Rats and Striped Ground Squirrel, both of which I've seen there on numerous occasions. Eventually we had to give up and move on as we had an appointment in Ol Pejeta Conservancy. One of the first mammals we found after coming in, was **Southern White Rhino**. But our appointment was within the endangered species enclosure, to meet the last two Northern White Rhinos left on earth, Najin and Fatu. You can read more about the story of Northern Whites and these two in particular [HERE](#). This is always a special, but rather sobering experience.

We spent a few more hours in Ol Pejeta, where we added **Eastern Black Rhino**, **East African Eland**, and **Tropical Steenbok** to our list. But we STILL hadn't found the Grass Rats or the Striped Ground Squirrel, despite trying in the areas where they usually are in OLP. So off we went on a detour back to Sandai (Tyler didn't push for this, I was just so frustrated that we hadn't found them yet, that I offered). FINALLY, at last light, we found the **Nairobi Grass Rats**, but not the Squirrel. We even hung around the sundowner spot waiting for the Striped Hyena, but that was not to be. Eventually, we had to leave to get to our next overnight stop at Creaky Cottage.

Our main target at Creaky Cottage was the Maned Rat, which I (and others) have seen there before. Unfortunately despite enlisting the help of the night guards to find it, and spending most of the night out, we were unlucky. We did see an unidentified Duiker/Suni in the thermal scope. The only new species we found here was an exotic invasive, **Black Rat** - not the most exciting find.

The following day, we drove up to Samburu National Reserve, and immediately began to add new species to the trip list. Tyler had seen some of these already in the Mara, but they were new for this trip. One of the first of these was **Cheetah**. Over the next 2 days we picked up **Slender Mongoose, Aardwolf, Striped Hyena, Leopard, Common Dwarf Mongoose, Grevy's Zebra, Greater Kudu, Kirk's Dik-dik, Guenther's Dik-dik, Bright's Gazelle**, and Beisa Oryx (new subspecies for the trip, but not a new full species).

From here we started to make our way back to Nairobi, and stopped in a few spots along the way to look for two bird endemics, Sharpe's Longclaw and Hinde's Pied Babbler. Unfortunately, we were not able to find them in the limited time we had before Tyler had to get to the airport for his international flight.

What we missed

Tyler had a rough wishlist that I used to design the itinerary. He was very aware and understanding of the fact that, of course, I could not guarantee ANY of the individual species, but I'd do my best. The biggest mammal misses were:

- **Maned Rat:** This one is so difficult. Every time I hear of a new place that they're being seen regularly, dogs start scaring them off, so they're no longer regular. I now have 2 places I'm fairly confident in for finding them, but it's still just very much the luck of the draw
- **Greater Cane Rat:** This was always going to be difficult. I have not yet figured out a semi-reliable place or strategy to view these. They seem to be caught on camera traps fairly often, but very few people see them in person. Most reports of Cane Rats in Kenya turn out to be misidentified Giant Pouched Rats (any large rat must be a Cane Rat).
- **Ader's Duiker:** Our only opportunity for this was in Arabuko Sokoke Forest. Unfortunately over the last 10 years their numbers have decreased significantly due to wire snare poaching. The snaring has now decreased with greater community engagement, and the duikers are apparently stable and maybe even slowly increasing (according to researchers there with camera traps), but finding them on foot during the day is like looking for a moving needle in a haystack.

- Sokoke Dog Mongoose: As mentioned above, the presence of lion in Arabuko Sokoke now means night drives are prohibited. This species is already near-mythical in its difficulty to find, and without the option for night drives, we had to give up on this. I'm confident, however, that we can work with the warden and find a solution.
- Large-spotted Genet: While on a night drive in the Tana River Primate National Reserve, we found a genet in the thermal scope. I managed to get my torch and binoculars on it. Large spots and black-tipped tail gave me confidence that it was a Large-spotted/Blotched Genet. Unfortunately Tyler, who was standing up in the roof hatch of the vehicle, was looking into the thicket from a different angle and never really got eyes on it, so he didn't count it towards his list. Ben had a glimpse, but admitted it wasn't good enough for a corroborative positive ID.
- Olive Ibis: There's always a small chance for this as you drive through the Salient in the Aberdares, but we didn't get lucky. The two best places to see this species were, unfortunately, a little too far out of the way on either side of our itinerary.
- Sokoke Pipit: We HEARD it! But getting eyes on it apparently wasn't meant to be
- Sharpe's Longclaw: We made one stop in an area they've been recorded in the past, but didn't find them. We drove a long way out of the way to a second spot, that was degraded, settled and likely no longer supported them. This is a Critically Endangered species that faces rapid habitat loss as its high altitude tussock grasslands are converted to plantations for timber, maize, etc. The most suitable land use to maintain this habitat is free range dairy and wool production, which is declining fast.
- Hinde's Pied Babbler: We only really gave this a shot on our last day as we headed back to Nairobi, but we did spend time in some very appropriate habitat where they're known to occur, so missing this was a disappointment.
- Tana River Cisticola: This is a disputed species that may represent aberrant Ashy Cisticola or Ashy-x-Rattling Cisticola hybrids. Not seen/positively identified since 1972, so not finding in on this trip wasn't a surprise.
- Narina's Trogon: These are sometimes common in the Tana River forest and Arabuko Sokoke, but on this trip, we only heard a single individual calling while watching the Sokoke Scops Owl. Unfortunately it was too deep into some VERY dense thicket and accessing it was impossible.
- Clarke's/Kilifi Weaver: An endemic. They'd just started breeding in the Dakatcha Woodland to the north of Arabuko Sokoke when we were there, and weren't venturing far from their nests, so we didn't see these.
- Montane Viper: As above. Weather was not on our side
- Side-striped Chameleon: We kept our eyes open throughout our time in its range, but chameleons can be very hard to find
- Aberdare Mountains Dwarf Chameleon: As above.
