Quick intro

This is the sequel to my first trip (<https://www.mammalwatching.com/community-post/trip-report-costa-rica-june-july-2023/>) two years prior. After having to pivot from another trip I had originally planned to do that fell through a bit last minute I decided to revisit Costa Rica with **Vino de Backer** (vino.monteverde@gmail.com / **WhatsApp +506 8502 7056**) again to target some of the species we hadn't seen the first time around

We saw 86 mammal species on this trip, 20 of which new.

On a usual night I would go out spotlighting while Vino and the others netted at the same time and then look at the bats when returning to camp, rinse and repeat. Daytime was usually used for a bit of exploration in the morning of whatever place we ended up in the night before and for travel between sites. This time I had a short list of (secondary) bird targets (Red-headed Barbet, Hoffmann's Antthrush, Northern Royal Flycatcher, Long-tailed Silky-flycatcher, Wrenthrush, Panama Thrush-tanager) that were doable on our itinerary and we made lunch stops where possible in places with feeders. All other sightings of birds and herps were incidental.

All bat sightings were either in hand or good views of perched individuals (no counting of fluttery shapes in the sky).

For the bats I mostly only recorded the first sighting as with netting, spotlighting, listing etc. it would have been too much work to keep track of the common species. Vino has detailed lists of course.

For all other mammals all sightings are recorded below, new species in bold.

The bird list contains only species not seen on the previous trip.

Biggest misses were probably sylvan's pocket gophers, Peter's disk-winged bat, the two species of hairy-legged bats, Armién's myotis, dusky-faced tanager and prong-billed barbet. But that's just a good excuse to go back again sometime soon.




