Walrus in downtown Oslo, Norway

A young, female walrus has been observed several places in Oslofjord during the past months. Right now (July 22, 2022) it is in Frogner Bay (Frognerkilen), which is a bay full of harbors for mostly pleasure boats in the city of Oslo. It is close to the Viking Ship and Kontiki museums and is 1-3 km west of Aker Brygge (Aker Harbor), which is walking distance from the castle, Parliament, main street (Karl Johan) in Oslo. As you might expect, the walrus, named "Freya" after a Viking goddess, has received a lot of attention from the public, some of it too much, too close, and too invasive, so the authorities are watching the situation carefully to protect Freya and the public. She has also damaged some boats and killed a swan. The authorities are evaluating whether they should move her.
