



When the UK government eased the travel restrictions and removed the traffic light system for foreign travel I decided it was high time to go and see some wildlife, after 18 months of being at home we were looking for places to go in our short (10 night window – including travelling days). After the amazing success of Alex, Jon and Venkats' trips to Kenya I thought there would be no where better. Royle Safaris has run trips to Kenya before and they have largely been your traditional safari trips. So I wanted to see if a specific more hard-core mammalwatching itinerary could be developed for group tours. If the success of Alex, Jon and Venkat could be repeated I would be looking to add a hardcore mammal focused trip to Kenya to my inventory and run this annually. So we looked at the places which would likely get us the most species in a reasonably sensible route logistically speaking (considering we were limited with time). We decided upon the Aberdares National Park, Meru National Park, Ishaqbini Reserve, Tana River Primate Reserve, Arabuko-Sokoke National Park and Tsavo East National Park.

There was a lot of driving involved and on any group trips we would run in the future we would extend the trip to at least 14 nights and so break up the longer days of travelling with more wildlife watching in between. Our driver Peter was exceptional, never tiring and ever alert and enthusiastic to add new species to his Kenyan mammal list (he is a bat convert now and will go looking for them when possible – although he did say that he would draw the line at looking in people's toilets for them – unlike me and Zarek), Zarek was our guide and like all guides Royle Safaris' hires he is hardworking and dedicated to spending time in the field. We did night drives / walks, pre-dawn walks / drives and long hours in the day looking for wildlife at every available opportunity. Where needed we also hired the services of rangers and local guides to take advantage of their local knowledge such as Adnil in Ishaqbini, Sayidi in Tana River Primate Reserve, Jetingo in Watamu and David in Arabuko-Sokoke.

Based on our short time period and the totals that Alex (70+), Jon (80+) and Venkat (surely a record mammalwatching trip of 126!) we set a target of 50-60 mammals and having been to Arabuko and Tsavo East before as well as other areas we would add to the overall mammal trip in future I was confident of many other species I knew we wouldn't be able to focus on or see on this short trip and we typically do not net or trap for small mammals so that could hinder us. So with a target of 50-60 species we were amazed to find ourselves scanning every rock on our way out of Tsavo East's gate at the end of the last game drive for a hyrax we could identify as rock hyrax to make our mammal count a nice round 100!! We failed on that, but then got wildebeest and Grant's gazelle along the side of the highway on the way to Nairobi airport so we broke the hundred mark. Amazingly we had to wait until our 99th mammal species before seeing a lion (yes we nearly went 8 nights in Kenya without seeing lions, but we were not in any places good for them (and many completely without them) for most of the trip and only gave ourselves a few hours in Tsavo East dedicated to looking for them. I think that if we had 100 mammals and no lions I don't know if I would happy or embarrassed) we were satisfied that the trip had been an overall remarkable success.

Anyone who has read Jon or Venkat's reports from Kenya in 2021 will know that the bat taxonomy in Kenya is being revised and many of the species have been placed in temporary clades pending further investigation and research. I have followed their taxonomy in this report as I have no bat expertise to superseded their information and knowledge. Also as with all of my bat sightings on any Royle Safaris trip report we include species in the list which we are at least 90% confident with the ID. Some we are 100% confident with but others we make educated (best) guesses based on observation, sonographs, behaviour, habitat and what other people have recorded in those locations previously. But we hold our hands up to some of our bat ID's as not 100% confirmed, but 90% is good enough for me ☺.

The bovid taxonomy of some of the species is also a bone of contention for some people, bovid taxonomy has been in flux (to put in politely) for at least the last decade since Groves & Grubb review in 2011 which pretty much elevated all subspecies globally to species level. This was reigned in somewhat by the *Mammals Handbook of the World Vol. 2* and is Ramon Castello's *Bovids of the World*. I largely follow *Mammals Handbook of the World* for my taxonomy unless there are newer convincing, conclusive or compelling reports, papers or evidence of splits or clumps in which I amend the list (such as the recent Giraffe splits by Julian Fennessy which is pretty much considered the current taxonomy now), but I accept that some of the splits are not universally accepted such as waterbuck being split into *Kobus elliprymnus* and *K. defassa* and the various species of *Madoqua* throughout the Horn of Africa; in these cases despite it being in the *Mammals Handbook of the World Vol. 2* I personally don't include both species in my list, as I have not seen evidence to suggest they are different species (in my opinion); but happy to be proven wrong as they would provide some new ticks ☺.

But as I always say to my clients and highlight where possible the species concept is a manmade construct and with at least 4 possible definitions of a species in use today (sometimes all at the same time) I take the approach of what makes the most sense to me and you should do the same. So you may see some of the species listed below and think they are subspecies and you are welcome to regard them as such or see some species here recorded from more than one location which would make the subspecies seen different species according to your taxonomy, again you can do that as you see fit.

We also didn't try particularly hard for birds, reptiles or amphibians – the ones we did get were incidental.
