MONGOLIA

MAY 19 – JUNE 6, 2018

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Mongolia is a very special country with amazing landscape, long and fascinating history and very special wildlife. The enormous, landlocked country of Mongolia is the 19th largest and the most sparsely populated fully sovereign country in the world. Its size is just over 1.5 million square kilometers but this is larger than the combined areas of Germany, France and Spain. Wedged between Russia and China with a population of three million, however, makes life very different in every aspect. On our 19 days long and mostly off-road odyssey, we wandered through the wide and wild steppes, deserts, semi-deserts, mountains, marshes and taiga of Genghis Khan and recorded a total of 224 species of birds and an outstanding 30 mammal species!

SYSTEMATIC LIST OF MAMMAL SPECIES RECORDED DURING THE TOUR

No	English and Scientific name	Sites visited and Comments
1	Mountain Hare Lepus timidus	Just two were seen in the north
2	Tolai Hare <i>Lepus tolai</i>	Several were seen
3	Daurian Pika Ochotona dauurica	A few seen at night in Hustai NP and one at daylight
4	Pallas's Pika <i>Ochotona pallasi</i>	Very common in the Gobi-Altai and seen in the Khangai too
5	Long-eared Hedgehog Hemiechinus auritus	We saw two at our Ger camp near Khongoryn Els and one later
6	Mongolian Jerboa Stylodipus anderwsi	A few seen near Boontsagaan Lake
7	Three-toed Jerboa Dipus sagitta	Fairly widespread and about 25 seen
8	Gobi Jerboa <i>Allactaga bullata</i>	A single individual was identified near Khongoryn Els
9	Siberian Jerboa <i>Allactaga sibirica</i>	The most common jerboa on the tour, about 50 seen
10	Brandt's Vole Lasiopodomys brandtii	Very common at Sangiin Dalai lake
11	Mid-day Gerbil Meriones meridianus	Just one was seen and identified with the white claws
12	Mongolian Gerbil Meriones unguiculatus	Fairly commonly encountered, especially in the Gobi-Altai
13	Mongolian Silver Vole Alticola semicanus	One was seen in the Barig Mountain
14	Mongolia Marmot Marmota sibirica	Common and widespread. Conspicuous in Hustai NP
15	Eurasian Red Squirrel <i>Sciurus vulgaris</i>	Both grey and black morphs were seen in the Khenty Mountain
16	Red-cheeked Ground Squirrel Spermophilus erythrogenys	Just a few observations in semi-deserts
17	Long-tailed Ground Squirrel Spermophilus undulatus	Many sightings of this prairie dog like critter
18	Alashan Ground Squirrel Spermophilus alashanicus	Just two were seen at Ikh Bogd Mountain
19	Corsac Fox Vulpes corsac	A family party was seen at Sangiin Dalai lake
20	Red Fox Vulpes vulpes	Three sightings in the tour
21	Grey Wolf Canis lupus	One was seen on our last night in Gorkhi – Terelj NP
22	Marbled Polecat Vormela peregusna	Fantastic looks of this stunner on our way to Gobi-Altai
23	Steppe Polecat Mustella eversmanni	One seen in the Jalman Valley in the north. Interesting data!
24	Pallas's Cat Otocolobus manul	One was spotlighted in Yolyn Am in the Gobi-Altai
25	Przewalski's Horse Equus ferus przewalskii	About 70 of these re-introduced horses were seen in the Hustai NP
26	Red Deer <i>Cervus elaphus</i>	Several showed well in Hustai NP
27	Siberian Ibex Capra sibirica	About 10 were seen in the Gobi Altai
28	Goitered Gazelle Gazella subgutturosa	A total of twelve were seen in the Gobi desert
29	Argali Ovis ammon	Just seven were observed in Yolyn Am in Gobi-Altai
30	Mongolian Gazelle Gazella gutturosa	Several sightings, about 100 seen altogether
